

Question by the defense.

Q.— Do you know the accused ?

A.— No sir.

Q.— Did you see the accused on the night of February the 14th at any time ?

A.— I can not say that I did.

Q.— Did you see the accused hit Thibault ?

A.— I did not see no hitting at all.

Q.— Did you see Morrison kick Thibault ?

A.— I can not say as I did.

Q.— How far from Thibault at the time of the fray ?

A.— About ten yards.

Q.— You were then not more than twenty five yards ?

A.— Yes sir.

Fifth witness for the prosecution Pte McNeill G. (W.M.S.H.) is sworn in and the charges against the accused read by the prosecutor.

Question by the prosecution.

Q.— In giving evidence that you are with the accused at that night, would you tell the court what happened ?

A.— I was in Wallingham on the night of February the 14th, I met there Morrison Smith and Mc Donald, we had quite a few drinks together, and do not remember after leaving Wallingham as I was pretty drunk at the time. I did not know about any fight till I was told about it in my company area the next morning.

Q.— Will you be able to say whether the accused ~~EXCEPT CHIEFLY~~ was drunk at that time ?

A.— Well he would feel pretty good when I was with him.

Q.— Do you remember anything about any other disturbances during that evening ?

A.— No sir.

SIXTH witness for the prosecution Pte. Thibault L.J. is sworn in and the charges against the accused read by the prosecutor.

Question by the prosecutor:

Q.— Pte. Thibault would you tell the court what happened on the night of February the 14th ?

A.— On my way returning home, I was beat up by four or five fellows and I do not know who they ~~were~~. There is not much I could say, because there is nothing I know about it, too sir.

Q.— Where were you when this beating took place ?

A.— Somewhere on the hospital road near the bus stop, I should say.

Q.— Whom had you been with ?

A.— Pte. Wamboldt, sir.
