

because at this stage of the session, unless this bill goes down to the other House very shortly, it will have very little chance of becoming law this year. The bill is in the right direction, I think.

Hon. Mr. McKAY—I understand there is some serious objection to the bill as it is now framed, and that a number of senators have been written to in regard to it, and that it was intended that these communications should be submitted to the promoters of the bill before it was pressed, and that is the reason it has been put off from day to day. I have no doubt something will be done to render the bill unobjectionable.

The bill was allowed to stand.
