You shall wish to know that I have arrived some time past at this place; but find that the schoolhouse is not ready, the Indian Department failing to keep faith with our worthy committee.

I am recommended to remain in Regina until steps are taken to prepare the school.

I need not tell you that I feel disappointed, but find comfort in this: "For if there be first the willing mind, it is accepted according to that a man hath, and not according to that he hath not." Rev. Mr. Urquhart tells me to "stand still and see the salvation of God," and Prof. Hart suggests that I "possess my soul in patience." Apart from the disappointment experienced, I am most pleasantly situated, boarding as I am with or in the same house as the Rev. Mr. Urquhart and his sweet young wife.

I wish to acknowledge three boxes of clothing from Woodstock, three from Toronto, and one from Teeswater, due no doubt to the thoughtful kindness of your Society.
