HATS AND CAPS.

We have the pleasure of handing you herewith our Weekly Prices Current, showing the condition of our market for the past week. Our quotations, it should be understood, represent the wholesale prices generally. In the making up of small orders, higher prices have to be charged. All quotations are duty paid, unless otherwise stated.

Commercial Report.

BREADSTUFFS .- Receipts of flour have been more liberal the past week, and prices are a shade easier. We hear of sales of No. 1 superfine, at \$8.50-choice brands being \$8.60. The demand for flour is large, and as navigation opens we look for an increased enquiry, as the country is very bare of stock.

Corn meal is a little lower. We quote \$5.25 to \$5.40. Oatmeal \$7.75 to \$8.00.

SALT .- Owing to continued arrivals of salt, with more coming, the market is much depressed; indeed, it is scarcely possible to make sales from ship in quantities. We quote from store at about 75c. per sack.

FREIGHTS .- Our freight market for the past week has exhibited more animation than for some time previously. As the season approaches for the mills to commence working, shippers are more desirous of operating, and tonnage being in very limited supply, rates have slightly advanced. There being no immediate prospect of vessels offering to any increased extent, it is fair to presume that freights will be firm for some time to come, and a still further advance in rates not unlikely. The following deal charters are reported: Mexican, 520, Warren Point, 69s. 3d.; Madeira, for Dublin, 72s. 6d.; Corra Linn, 397, Port Rush, 75s.; Jano, 230, Dundalk, 7cs.; Harrisburg, 541, Newport or Cardiff, at 70s., or Bristol, at 71s. 3d.; Wabena, 599, Liverpool, 72s. 6d.; C. O. Wetmore, 900 Liverpool, 72s.; two new ships, to be launched first week in May, viz., Abassinia, about 850 tons, and Prince Leopold, about 1200 tons-both for Liverpool, at 71s. 3d.

West India freights are very dull. The season for the shipment of sugar box shooks is nearly over, and after the engagements of this week are provided for, there will not be much of that description of cargo to ship, except at very low rates of freight. The charters reported are as follows: Bark Merrimack, at 24c. ; Ormus, 486, at 23c. and \$7.25 ; H. P. Russell, 427, at same rates; S. V. Nichols, 167, at \$7.50-all for north side Cuba; Enterprise, 109, Remedios and back, for \$1250, lump sum.

There is more demand for vessels coastwise,

and rates slightly better. The following transactions are reported : Duke of Newcastle, 86; Violet, 56; Cindora Day, 68-all for Boston, at \$3.75; Romp, for New York, at \$5.50 for lumber, \$1.10 for laths ; Ludia May, for Philadelphia, \$5.00 and \$1.00. Some small vessels have been chartered to carry salt to Campobello, at 91 to 10c. per sack.
