VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that as foon as the faid Bridge is com- VI. And be it further charged by the authority aloready, that as tool as the faith pleted, no other Bridge shall be passable and opened for the use of the public, no perfon or perions fhall erect, or caufe to be erected, any Bridge or Bridges or Work, or ufe any Ferry for the Carriage of any Persons, Cattle or Carriages whatsoever, for hire, acrofs the faid Arm St. Nicolas within half a league above the faid Bridge; and if any perfon or perfons shall erect a Toll Bridge or Toll Bridges over the laid Arm St. Nicolas in the faid limits, he or they shall pay to the faid Jacques Morin, Junior, his heirs, executors, curators and affigns, treble the Tolls hereby imposed, for the perfons, Cattle and Carriages, which shall pass over fuch Bridge or Bridges; and if any perfon or perfons shall, at any time, for his or gain, pass or convey any perfon or perfons, Cattle, Carriage or Carriages, across the faid Arm St. Nicolas within the limits aforelaid, such Offender, or Offenders, shall, for each Carriage, Perfon or Animal fo carried across forfeit and pay the fum of forty Shillings, currency. Provided that nothing in this A& contained, thall be construed to deprive. the public from paffing any of the Fords, of the faid Arm St. Nicolas within the limits aforesaid.

Penalty on persons pulling down the Bridge or Toll Houses.

VII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that if any perform fhall malicioufly pull down, burn or deftroy the faid Bridge, or any part thereof, or the Toll Houle to be credled by virtue of this Act, every perfon fo offending and. being thereof lawfully convicted, shall be deemed guilty of Felony.

Jacques Morin required to ereet the Bridge three within years.

VIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the faid Jacques Morin, Junior, to entitle himfelf to the benefits and advantages to him, by this Act granted, shall and he is hereby required to erect and complete the faid Bridge. Toll House, Turnpike and coveniencies within two years from the day of the paffing of this Act; and if the fame shall not be completed within the time last mentioned, lo as to afford a convenient and lafe paffage, over the faid Bridge, he the faid Jacques Morin, Junior, his heirs, executors, curators and affigns, fhall ceafe to have any right, title or claim of, in or to the Tolls hereby imposed, which shall from thence forward belong to His Majefty ; and the faid Jacques Morin, Junior, fhall not, by the faid Tolls, or in any other manner or way, be entitled to any reimburfement of the expences he may have incurred in and about the building of the faid Bridge; and in cafe the faid Bridge, after it shall have been erected and completed, fhall, at any time, become impassable or unlafe for Travellers, Cattle or Carriages, he the faid Jacques Morin, Junior, his heirs, executors, curators or affigns, fhall, and they are hereby required, within eighteen months from the time. at which the faid Bridge shall, by His Majefty's Court of General Quarter Sessions. of the Peace, in and for the faid Diffrict of Quebec, be afcertained to be impaffable or unfafe, and notice thereof, to him or them, by the faid Court given, to caufe the fame to be rebuilt or repaired, and made fafe and commodious for the paffage of Travellers, Cattle and Carriages; and if within the time last mentioned, the laid Bridge be not to repaired or rebuilt, as the cafe may require, then the faid Bridge or fuch part or parts thereof, as shall be remaining, shall be, and be taken and confidered to be the property of His Majefty; and after fuch default to repair or sebuild.
