BRICKING UP THE HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

The action of the County Council of Perth at its late session in repealing all by-laws forming High School Districts and arrangements connected therewith, has been the subject of considerable criticism during the past few days. The cause of this action is well known to the County Council and has been the subject of the Stratford High School, from which it was deriving benefit in return, there being no pupils from that township attending the Stratford School. An effort had been made to detach the township from the Stratford High School District and attach it to St. Mary's, but owing to Blanshard not being willing to grant more than \$150 per annum, no arrangement was effected. When the question was brought before the County Council last week the representatives of the rural municipalities, with the exception of one or two members from the township, were in favor of abolishing the Districts entirely. A deputation from the Listowel High School District walked upon the County Council, and in a very forcible manner interposed with existing arrangements in District No. 3. But the Council had determined on its action in the matter, and a law to abolish the Districts at the end of the present year was adopted. The effect of this decision will be to place the township municipalities in a position of complete independence in respect to the High Schools. Under the District system the High School Boards are invested with power, and a law to abolish interpretation of the Act, to levy rates upon the municipalities forming such Districts, the cost of new school buildings, with the knowledge that the High School Board, exercise this power, should they choose to do so, is a matter of little surprise. London, June 26.—The news of the death of the Prince Imperial of France, which reached here last night, and was circulated in the lobbies of the House of Commons, on Friday, the 26th, was a terrible shock to the Ex-Emperor Eugenic—National Sympathy. The London journals, though deeply deploring the Prince's death, regard it as the end of Lappet's reign in France. A curious anecdote is told in the following particulars of the death of the Prince Imperial. The body of the Prince, when found, lay on its back with eighteen inches of earth covering the body from the chest to back, two in the side, and one destroying the right eye. A lock of hair, medals and religious medals were found around the body. The Prince was very adventurous. His movement of a party of the Prince Imperial, who was assigned to a Metic Field, was a terrible shock to the Ex-Emperor Eugenic—National Sympathy.
