**DUNNVILLE GAS FIELD IS GREAT**

A Big Find is Reported—Brantfordites are Interested in Prospects.

Brantfordites are said to be interested in the natural gas expansion as told in the following despatch from Dunnville:

That the Dunnville natural gas basin is expanding has already been proven.

For nearly two weeks, Mr. Thomas J. McCutcheon, the well known contractor and natural gas producer has had a "wild cat" well drilled to the proper depth but shrouded in mystery. When he drilled deep enough, that he had a large well he shut it in to acquire more territory. This well is located on the Lyburner farm, Canboro road, about four and a half miles west of Dunnville. The natural gas basin in this locality, and the consensus of opinion among gas experts was that Mr. McCutcheon was merely separating himself from some of his lease change.

Last Saturday afternoon this mystery well was opened to the public and through the courtesy of Mr. McCutcheon, the writer was taken by auto to this great well. Mr. McCutcheon himself acted as chauffeur. One turn of the gate valve made the well size and snort like a railroad locomotive blowing off steam.

This gas levitation hoared louder and louder until the noise became so deafening that the cows were glad to beat a hasty retreat.

The well was brought under subjection and treated to a mercurial test. The mercury was put over the two inch pipe. The volume of gas forced the mercury up five and two-tenths inches, after which it was figured by a mathematical set of tables which are as accurate as a Fahrenheit thermometer. This well was found to have a production of one million one hundred thousand cubic feet in 24 hours, making one of the largest gas wells ever drilled in the Dunnville field. He has 3,000 acres of territory under lease, almost solidly blacked. The only man who has anything around him is Wm. J. Atkins, the well

**A WIFE IS SHOT DEAD**

Sordid Story of a Very Unhappy Marriage in Old Land.

Mr. Wynn Baxter, the East London coroner, held an inquest yesterday at Poplar Coroner's Court, concerning the death of Harriet Silber (38), the wife of an electrician, of Tredegar road, Bow, who was shot dead at that address on Tuesday last.

A sister of deceased said deceased was a widow when she married Silber for twenty years ago. There were four children by the second husband, who were now alive. The couple had lived very unhappily and witness had seen the husband assault, deceased, and heard him threaten to kill her more than once. On 5th November last he came to witness's house with a revolver which he fired off several times in the back yard and kitchen.
