The Times says that judging from the annual report of the Government Board, the return just issued with regard to the work-ing of the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1875, are to a great extent highly satis-factory, at least, in one sense of the term. The Act has been found to work well in many parts of the clifferent analyses show that comparative freedom from adulteration is onroughs. In most localities many of the samples of food and drugs submitted to the analysts were found to contain dele-terious and foreign substances. In the Metropolitan districts the reports state that out of 4,177 samples of food 515 were adulterated ; and out of 110 drugs seven were adulterated. All over the country similar results were exhibited, but the Act will no doubt more and more interfere with the adulterations.
