From DR. RUSSELL'S ESSAY on the Nature of Cholera.

Atkinson, Esq.—I am desirous, at the present moment, of directing the attention of scientific readers to a very interesting phenomenon, more or less present, in the collapsed stage of Cholera, which seems to have hitherto escaped the observation of medical men, namely, animal electricity or phosphorescence of the human body.

Thirdly,—I have maintained the theory of a single electric fluid, and endeavoured to show that it is adequate to account for all the facts of the science, without involving the obvious difficulties of the double theory.

In the first stage, I would recommend an emetic of ipecac. A gentle cathartic may also be necessary. If the attack is not very severe, the cure may be completed with a few doses of ipecac.
