Mr. John Hannah, of Tuckersmith, sowed a quantity of peas and oats on Saturday last. This is the first of the season.

Mr. W. Robertson, Wingham, has returned from Toronto, where he has been doing parliamentary work during the session.

Mr. Moses Hanna, of the 8th concession, McKillop, has bought the Kyle farm in Tuckersmith, consisting of 150 acres, for \$7,100.

Messrs. Scarff & Ferguson, dry goods merchants, of Stratford, have decided to open a branch store in the Postoffice block, Brussels.

Messrs. Howe & Co., Brussels wollen mills, have just made a large purchase of about 3,000 and 4,000 lbs. wool from Port Burwell.

The *Gorrie Fiddler* says—Messrs. Smith & Malcolm, of Brussels, have purchased the furniture factory in Wroxeter, formerly owned by W. Z. Watts.

Mr. Anthony Mines, an old resident of the first concession, Grey, held a large clearing sale of stock last week. He has leased his farm to his sons and goes to live in Gorrie.

Mr. Michael Whitmore, for a number of years a resident of Tuckersmith, left last Saturday week, for his farm in the township of Hay, where he intends to remain for the future.

Matthew Murray has sold his farm on the 11th concession, McKillop, to his brother John, now in California, for \$5,000 and this year's crop. It is a good farm but has no buildings.

Mrs. Wm. Ballantyne & Son, Brussels, have purchased the brick store, corner Turnberry and Thomas streets, from S. W. Laird, paying \$1,975 for it. It will suit the egg business well.

John Common has sold the old homestead consisting of fifty acres on the 8th concession, McKillop, to his neighbor, John McIntosh, for \$3,300. Mr. Common still owns 75 acres on the 11th concession, and he is preparing to build a barn and house on it.

John McLeod, son of Mr. Roderick McLeod, Brucefield, formerly student in Seaford Collegiate Institute, and who has been attending a Medical College in New York, has just graduated as an M. D. at that institution.

Harland Bros. were the purchasers of the hardware stock of R. M. Racey, Clinton, on Wednesday. We believe it is their intention to continue the business in the present premises; quite a number of intending buyers were present.

Wm. Habkirk, eldest son of Mrs. John Habkirk, Seaford, who has been living with his uncle, Mr. J. Cowan, McKillop, for the past three years, left for Manitoba on Tuesday last. His present destination is Westall, but he intends to reside permanently in the province.
