Some shots were fired, the account continues, Montaiers being killed and several Frenchmen being wounded, whereupon the French lost control with the result that several women and children were killed. Prominent citizens of Beuthen were taken as hostages, the neswpaper adds, and an inquiry was opened. Early accounts of the Beuthen incident given Monday in Oppeln advices to the London Daily Mail declared that the French battalion entered the town amid hostile demonstration by the German population and that later Major Montaiers was shot dead by a civilian who
