## President of U.M.W. Talks Plainly to Wolvin

STATION POLICY NOT JUSTIFIED.

Following correspondence between John L. Lewis, President of the Mine Workers of America and President of Besco has just been received in the Sydney Post.

It is considered in conjunction with the text of telegraphic correspondence between R. M. Wolvin, President of the British Empire Steel Corporation and John L. Lewis, National President of the United Mine Workers of America, as published in the edition of the 27th of the present week and the following letters exchanged between Wolvin and Lewis, copies of which were supplied to the executive committee of the International Union, were handed to The Post by District President J. MacLeod, this morning.

The first letter is from Wolvin to Lewis dated February 11th, in which he states the company's view of the situation in Nova Scotia, as follows:

fy the starvation policy which you suggest in your communication. I am not unmindful of the fact that your corporation, in the operation of its mines in that territory, has to encounter complex and difficult problems of production, distribution and sales. As an offset to these problems, however, your corporation pays to its employees the lowest scale of wages of any mining district on the North American continent.

I think the Mine Workers' representatives are being liberal with your corporation in displaying a most tolerant attitude if they agree to their renewal of the present wage scale for an additional contract period. My personal suggestion on this matter, as I stated to you over the long-distance telephone, is for a settlement to be made upon the basis of the wage schedule as set forth in the contract which terminated January 15th. Such policy contemplates the abandonment by the men of their demand for wages increases; and it contemplates the abandonment by the British Empire Steel Corporation of their demand for a reduction in wages. The policy would also take into consideration the operating and sales problems of your corporation. Conditions in 1925 in that territory cannot be any worse than in 1924, and there are substantial indications which will verify the judgment that will be much improved.

I would be glad to have you give serious consideration to the most practical proposition of a renewal of the old wage agreement for a stipulated period, which will be jointly agreed upon between our mutual representatives in that territory.

Dear Mr. Lewis—I have your letter of February 13th, and have carefully noted what you have to say. The results of our operations for 1924 are a sufficient answer to the position you take on the wage structure as far as Nova Scotia is concerned. I have yet to find out where the money is available from to pay the wages in excess of the sale value of the product produced.

Ever since my connection with the Corporation your representatives have been absolutely unfair in their consideration of the necessities of our situation. I have yet to find any disposition on their part to do other than use force in the settlement of questions.
