

The Return of Germany

Hamburg Fremdenblatt: An official statement has been issued of the formal entry of Germany to membership of the International) Chamber of Commerce. This step was imminent before the war, but hostilities naturally prevented its achievement, and even after the war difficulties supervened until the administrative council of the Chamber declared about a year ago that membership of the League of Nations was not a pre-requisite condition to membership of the Chamber. This membership is not likely to become effective before Sentember next, and Germany will probably make her voice heard in this body for the first time at its October assembly in Paris.
