ALBERTA GOVERNMENT INVESTIGATE

PROPERTY OWNERS DETERMINED TO PROBE ISSUE OF WRITS IN SATISFACTION OF ASSESSMENT CLAIMS FOR ALLEGED WORTHLESS IRRIGATION PROJECT

At a meeting of property owners affected by the Springbank irrigation project of right in territorial government days, a petition, addressed to the territorial government, was prepared, in which the petitioners ask for a thorough investigation of the issue of writs in satisfaction of assessments for irrigation. The writs were issued in 1908, due on unpaid debentures for five years ending December 31, 1912. A further additional sum is now owing for a period of five years ending December 31, of last year, and the total indebtedness is now in the neighborhood of \$1,000,000. It is estimated that approximately 3,000 property owners are affected, and writs have been served against many of them.
