Fairness To British Government, Says King, Demands An Answer.

OTTAWA, Oct. 21 .- (By Canadian Press.)—In a letter written by himself just ended—the further sum of \$7,099,880 were given to the Canadian Press to-Hon. Arthur Meighen, respecting purchase and shipments of munitions from England to Canada during the present summer, and states that these questions are "all-important, and are deserving of an immediate and explicit reply."


