"In allowing the Japanese to take Port Arthur, Gen. Tso was actuated by motives Arthur, Gen. Tso was actuated by motives of the deepent strategy, and the able man-ner in which he attained his end without allowing his opponents to penetrate his de-signs, stamps him as one of the greatest military commanders China has ever seen. "Knowing Peking to be the altimate goal of the Japanese, Gen. Tso was astisfied that should a too obstimate resistance be offered at any point, the Japanese would leave the Chinese unconquered in his rear and would hall. He push on to the capital ; whereas if an im-portant place like Port' Arthur should fall into their hands the little men would evjoy the sensation as children do a new toy, and it would delay them in their march while the road to Peking was rendered im-pregnable.
