## LOCAL HOSPITALS ON APPROVED LIST

List of Standardized Hospitals Released By American College of Surgeons.

Philadelphia, Oct. 26.—In the presence of a great international congress of surgeons and hospital people at the Bellevue-Stratford Hotel, today, Franklin H. Martin, M. D., Chicago, Director General of the American College of Surgeons, officially announced the list of approved hospitals up to October 1st, 1925. This list is the result of the eighth annual Hospital Standardization survey made by the American College of Surgeons, including 2389 hospitals. In presenting the report he said in part: "This list of approved hospitals is of general interest. The patient can more intelligently and more safely choose a hospital and a doctor when ill. The young women with the noble ambition to become a nurse is assisted in her selection of a training school. The recent medical graduate eager for more practical experience seeks the approved hospital for his internship. Federal, state, municipal and philanthropic organizations frequently consult this list in their selection of institutions when rendering financial assistance. Already the American Railway Association has urged their 14,000,000 patients passing through patient so far as possible hospitals approved by the American College of Surgeons. The United States Army, Navy, Veterans Bureau, Public Health Service, and National Homes for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers share enthusiastically in this program and the approved hospitals of these groups appear on the list today.

## IMPORTANCE OF CHURCH UNION

A Noble Experiment in Christian Unity, Says Toronto Clergyman in Ottawa

Ottawa, Oct. 24.—Describing the United Church of Canada as a noble experiment in Christian unity and its great task in the world as a singular, ly romantic enterprise, Rev. J. R. P. Selater, of Toronto, spoke to a large gathering of church people in Dominion Church last week. The movement for Church Union, which had consummated in the new church in Canada, Dr. Selater said, was one of the most significant historical since the reformation, and it had given to the Canadian people of formed the new church the responsibility of showing the world the realm of practical statesmanship. It would be impossible to overestimate the significance of the movement, he declared.

The evangelical churches of the continent were watching eagerly the experiment in church union in Canada to-day.

Speaking of the task set before the united church, he said it would be a tragedy to rest now and say it is all settled. We are just at the beginning of the task, and not at the finish of it," he said, with emphasis.

The American College of Surgeons appreciates the opportunity to better hospital and medical services for the 14,000,000 patients passing through the hospitals of the United States and Canada annually. This movement has now become part of the social and economic life of our people. The requirements are minimal and fundamental. They are applicable to any hospital regardless of size, type or location. Any institution, ethical and honest, reaching the standard is acceptable. The public is therefore asking why certain hospitals are not on the list.

The hospitals whose names appear on the approved list today are those recognized as fulfilling the fundamental requirements for good service to the patient, as assured through (a) efficient staff organization; (b) adequate diagnostic and therapeutic facilities; (c) trained personnel; (d) complete case records; (e) periodic check-up or medical audit of the clinical work of the hospital.

From the 1925 survey of 2395 hospitals in the United States and Canada 1564 or 65.7 per cent meet the requirements of Hospital Standardization. In the Province of New Brunswick out of 15 hospitals surveyed 13 or 86.7 per cent have been accredited and appear today on the approved list as announced by the American College of Surgeons.

The asterisk indicates that certain hospitals have accepted the requirements which result in the best scientific care of the patient but are not, for the lack of time or other acceptable reasons, carrying them out in every detail.

## TRIAL FLIGHT OVER AMERICAN WATERS

Baltimore, Md., Oct. 20.—The Napier super-marine S4, one of the two British seaplanes, entered in the Schneider Cup race to be held at Bay Shore, near here, Oct. 24, made its first trial flight over American waters, yesterday. Captain N. G. Biard, who will pilot the ship in the race, took the craft aloft, although his right hand is still encased in a cast splint, due to an injury received on shipboard, while en route to this country.

The S4 made an official world's record of 226 miles an hour in a test flight in England, prior to her shipment here. The British team expressed approval of the ship's performance, after the flight yesterday.

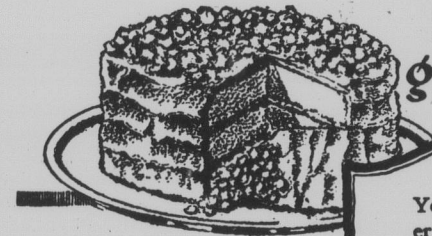
