TAKE NOTICE that the Corporation of the City of Toronto will apply to the Parliament of Canada, at its next session for such legislation as may be necessary to confirm an Act of the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, 49th Vic. Cap. 66, as amended, which authorizes the said Corporation of the City of Toronto to straighten and improve the Don River from the line of Bloor-street to the waters of Toronto Bay or Lake Ontario and to construct on each side of the straightened channel of the said river an Esplanade and to allocate the same for the purposes in said Act mentioned and to confirm section 8 of the said Act, which provides that "no railway company shall acquire any exclusive right of property in or control over the reservation for railway purposes to be made upon the said Esplanade of any part thereof, and that all railways shall be entitled to the use thereof upon equal terms and upon paying their just share and proportion of any expenditures which shall have been made or which may at any time require to be made for construction, maintenance and repairs of tracks, switches and other necessary work required for the proper use thereof and the fee of the said land shall always remain in the Corporation of the City of Toronto," and to declare that the expropriation classes of the "Railway Act" do not apply to the improvement now being constructed under the authority of the said Provincial Act.
