Editor. World: The Sunday blue laws proposed by Mr. Charlton should meet with the prompt denunciation of all who believe in even the ghost of liberty. Having obtained a little noteriety as an opponent of the Jesuits, he now hopes to use it in deluding well-meaning people into narrow-minded enactments, which are as hostile to the spirit of the age as anything to be found in Jesuitism.

When D'Alton McCarthy speaks on Equal Rights we appreciate him as a natural lover of liberty. But Mr. Charlton is not so regarded; ene cannot help regarding him as a sort of puritanical Jesuit of equal narrow-mindedness with the Jesuits whom he opposes. His idea in delivering us from the shackles of French Jesuitism is not to give us freedom but to monopolies the privilege of binding us hand and foot with fetters forged by himself.

Idolatry of any kind is bad enough, but certainly the last decade of the nineteenth century in this land of freedom is not going to legally enact Sunday idolatry to suit the medieval views of Mr. Charlton. Medievalism is the same thing, whether it may come from a puritanical Jesuit or from a Catholic Jesuit.

Had Mr. Charlton lived in the days of Ignatius Loyola, his mental proclivities would have won for him a lieutenancy under that remarkakle religious leader. His abilities find employment, not in expanding but in restricting all restrictionists but himself. He is a wealthy man and accordingly his blue law bill allows him to drive his coach and four one or 30 miles as he pleases on Sunday, while it would make 100 poor men criminals who would dare to charter a railway car or a steamboat at 10 cents a head to get a breath of God's fresh air on Sunday. Great was Diana of the Ephesians, and great as is Charlton of the Yankee Connecticut Puritans, both will go down in history as curiosities of their times and fetterers of intellectual progress.


