It is now between the seasons, and trade is consequently quiet. This applies particularly to sugars, in which activity is not looked for till the canning and preserving of fall fruits begin. Sugars are unchanged here, but in New York are used to be completely cleaned out. Canned goods market is unsettled, in view of the uncertainty with regard to tomatoes. The plants have been making plenty of wood, but owing to the cool weather the fruit is slow in materializing. In the meantime the wholesale houses are refusing orders for large lots. Canned salmon is about the only thing in the market which has any life, and even in this the short run is causing some anxiety.

Trade has been fair during the week, and there is every prospect of its continuance. Stocks are full. Canadian manufacturers having given early deliveries this year. Goods from Great Bitiain have also been pushed forward earlier than usual. There is a great variety of dress goods in the market, and these are of course receiving first attention. Variety of checks is large and they seem to be the prevailing style. After the plain lines of French goods the contrast is marked. Staple trimmings are now coming the repidity to hand and they are being picked up by early buyers. Prices are low and there seems to be but little slaughtering compared with other years. The general feeling in the trade is that a season of prosperity is being entered upon. This is made more apparent by the comparative promptitude with which payments on paper maturing during the month have been met. The limited number of failures is also a good index.
