I pray that the consolations of the Gospel may cheer and comfort the bereaved family, and that his brothers and sisters may imitate him in following the Lord Jesus that their end may be peace. 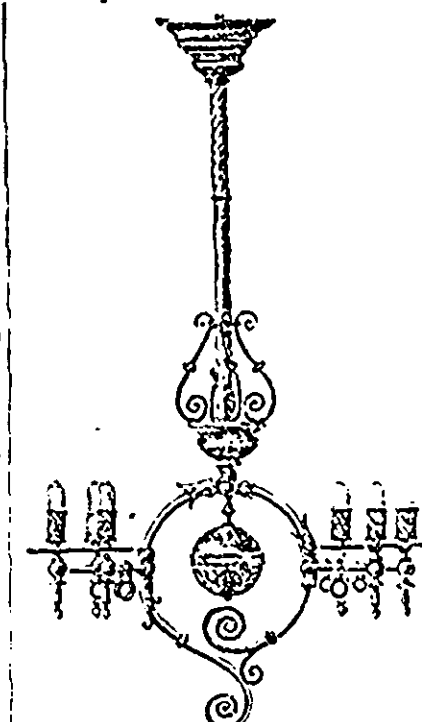

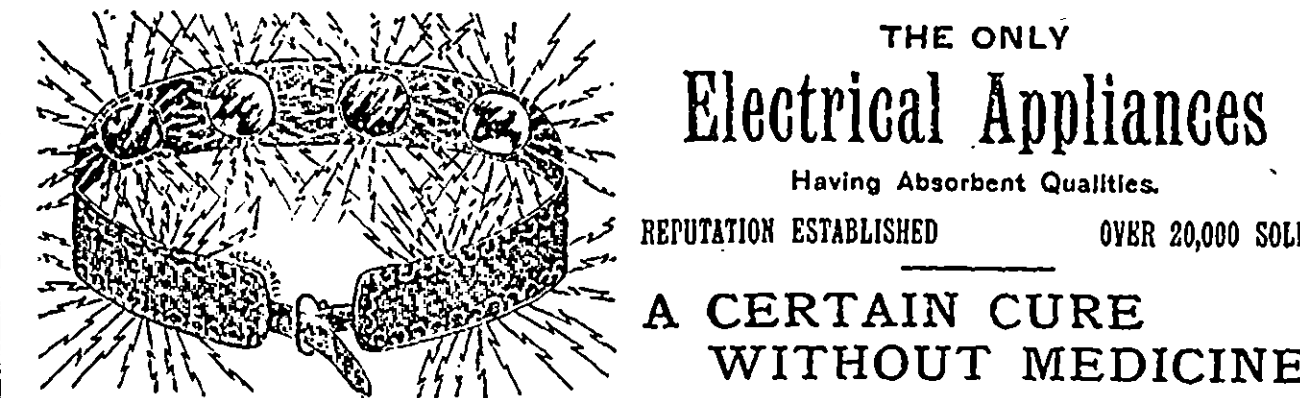
