A Two-cent Rate.

Hon, Wm. Mulock, Post Master-General of Canada, has introduced a bill into Paliament which provides for

a two-cent letter rate instead of three cents as at present. This will be heartily received by the business men all over the country There is another provision in the bill that does not meet with the approval of all i. e. a rate of a half-cent a pound will be imposed on newspapers, which have hitherto been carried free to subscribers.
