## EDITORIAL NOTES.

Wedina Cimess. We cannot pass over the Royal Wedding without some reference to the important ovent. May every good fortuno attend Prince George and his fair bride, and may the cordial feoling which exiats between tho public and tho young couplo be intensified. To our renerated and fast aging Quenn tho marriage must give signal pleasuro, reviving as it does the story of her own happy courtship and hor peacoful wedded life. To many of us it may seem but a short time since Albert Edward l'ince of Wales brougbt to an English home the "Sea King's daughtor from over the seas," who has won from all love and coteem, but the yoars havo passed swiftly and the second son of that union is alroady in tho manks of the Benedicts. The Princess May has shown horsolf to bo 2 loving, kindhearted and active woman. If she bat follows tho lines laid down by the Queen and by the Princess of Wales she will of a cortainty bo one of the most popular and most useful womon in the wor:d.

A Hion-Handed Governor.-Governor Alfgeld, of Illinois, has placed himsolf in a curious position by his recent action in grantiog pardons 10 threo famous anaichiato, who for the past firo seara have been paying tho penalty of imprisonment for thoir part in the famous Chicago riots. Tho trial of the Chicago anarchiats will lovg be remembered. A desperato war was waged by the lawjers for the defence, and the suit was carried to the higheat tribunal in the State and finally to tho Supreme Court of the Tnited States. At each new trial the oarly conviction was cunfirmed. Iet Governor Altge'd nor deciares in an official document that he dicioarges these prisoners bocause thoy wore the victims of a prejudiced judge and a packed jury, and that thero has never been sny adequate prouf of gailt against them. When it is remembered that soveral anaichists wero tried before the same judge and jury, and wero condemned to doath, the Guvornor's act:on appoars in a far more sorious ight. Is he accusing tho courts of his count'y of porpetrating oficial murder, is he libollitg the honor and justico of the legal authorities of tho land, or is he simply oxpressing a privato opinion $t$ He has c rainly a right to a privato opinion on tho matter, but as a Government official he had do right to incorporate bis opinion in his proclamation of rocease, and it is more than prubable that he may have to make reparation to the maligned authorities.

Cherorerg in Bubiness Life--Chiof Iarris of the Cherokees is a prominent party in a recent financial transaction rith the U. S. Government. Tho tribe, who aro hard up for monoy, recently sold $88,200,000$ worth uf land to the Governmont, and in fayment have been allowed to isaue nome S6,640,000 worth of bonds bearing interest at 4 por cont. Thoso bonds are ondorsed by tho Govornmont. The chief is now in Wall Street, Now York, nogotiating for their salo, after which ho will roturn to his tribe and divido tho spoils jer capita among his peoplo.

Chear Steel.-Thoro is a probability that bofore long a radical change will bo mado in the manufacture of steol tools. Tho high prico of the good qualities of stool has long beon a stumbling stone to the impecunious work$\min$, who yet found it to his advantage to purchase implements of the best and consequently of tho most costly quality. An Amorican inventor, howover, claines that ho has discovered a process by which the cheap grades of steol may be transformed into as goos steel as is now in the market. The procoss is basod on the fact that steol is a carbide of irsn, and that the quality of the motal is docided by the amount of carbon of which it is possessed. Ho coains that porr steel can be baked by mosns of a special furnaco in a carbonscoous mixturn, and that tho rosalt will be that the lowest class s!col or that which has the loast carbon in its composition, will bo transformed into the most onduring and valuable motal. We truat to hear of the practical application of the invention at an early date.

Aypairs in India.-General Lord Roberts has been addressing a British militsry audionce on tho interes:ing subject of Anglo-Indian affairs. His Lordship has cortainly had opportunity to form careful and concise opinions on the malter, and many recont reforms in military mattera in the Eust are puroly his own work. Ho contends that one of the chief needs of India is that the military forco should be thoroughly organized, as it now is, and that constant attention ehou d be given to obtaining internal and oxiarnal sccurity. The 70,000 British soldiers now resident in India, suppler.av. Ifed by tho Imperial service troops zaised in the nativo provinces, are quilo capable of maintaining order, oxcopt in tho ovent of a Russian invasion whon further aid ::ould bo noeded from Groat Britain. A great point has been gained with tho Amer r of Afghanistan, who has been accorded British protection on tho condition that the foreign relations of his country shall be under liritish contro!. The move will strongthen the power of the British Army, and will do much to prevent Rusian intrigue.

Voices Fnoy tine Past.-An intorosting corsmony took place in Toronto last week at which a monument orectod to the momory of two Cansdian patriots was unvoi'ed. A half contury ago Samual Lount and Peter Matthows wero hang as a penalty for their supposed trasson. They wero atorn advocates of political freedom, and resenting the "family compact" system which then provailed. thoy had at:ompted to overawe the Governor, Sir Fraucis IIead, into granting those rights and privileges to which they were ontilled as British citizens. The upriting was checked at its inception and the two leaders paid with thnir lives tor their tomority, although instructions wose roceived from England that clemency was to be oxercised. Even to this day we feol the effact of the vigorous action of the ill-fated men, for oring to the popular remonstrance caused by their tragic end, many investigations were made, the system of "family compact" government was brisen up, aud the foundations for a more equitable syatom was laid. It is fitting indoed that recognition, oven at this lato day, should be made of theso far-away patriots, of whom it may be said that their deeds live after tinem even to redound to their honor.

Trahasn Censorsult. - Christian migsionarios in Turkey are having a hard time of it with tho pross consors, whu have lately turned their attention to the circulation of tho Bible. The Sublime Porto bas viows which aro nut in accurdenco with thoso recorded in holy writ, and ho doos not mean that views contrary to his uwn shall be widely known, although he doee not intend to stamp himself as beiog behind tho times by banishing the Biblo frow his duminions. Accordingls many changes have been mado in the rext. Expressions such as "Ihy Kingdum Come" bavo been oxpanged last they shon.d foster discon ent amung the subjects of the Empire. All passages relating to the rostoration of the Jews to Palestine and of the accund cuming of Christ ato umi.tod. Such oxprossions us "the liberty of tho Go yo. ' aro not permissib.o. for it is feared that they may suggest the thuoght that " liberty "does not cxist in Turkey. The frequent exhortations to charity and goud vorks are to bo omitted uniess tho nature of the charit. ablo rork is defined and is deemed desirablo by the cenyora. Sir Charice Ford, tho British Ambassador, is making a rigorous fight to obtain redrese for theso interfurences, and the Sultan is also looking into the mattor. The result of the struggle cannot fall to be of deep intereat to the roligiour world,
