SALT is arriving earlier this year than usual. Prices have ruled fair all winter. Yesterday, by auction, a cargo affoat was sold at 75 cents per bag for Liverpool; and, afterwards, by private bargain, to arrive, at less, but PNT. To-day, stored sold at S1 to 85 cents.

Molasses have advanced, and sweet Muscovado bas again reached 30 cents per gallon.

Sugars—The market is rather firmer this week for Bright, Raw and Refined. At the Refinery, prices are as follows: Loaves, 12\(^3\) cents; Dry crushed and ground, 11\(^3\), extra Ground, 12\(^1\); Crushed A, 11; Yellow Refined, 8\(^1\) to 10; Sugar House Syrup, 40 to 50.

TEAS.—This market is still inactive. Low grades are not over plenty, while the stock of fine is heavy and prices nominal.

Soar-Liverpool has been sold 5\(\frac{1}{2}\) to 5\(\frac{1}{2}\) cents for new, and five cents for last years' importations. Favorite brands have been scarce.

Liquons—We have no improvement to note in this market. In Foreign Spirits and Wines the demand continues very limited with a slight downward tendency in prices.
