form. A challenge cup or trophy pre-
sented by Messrs. Davis & Sons, of Mont-
real, and \$657 and a special badge add-
ed by the D. R. A. Open to all efficient
members of the active militia, etc., as sti-
pulated in the conditions of the Mac-
dougall match. The Davis & Sons' cup
or trophy will be awarded to that corps
or battalion having six members compet-
ing for individual prizes, whose scores
shall collectively make the highest aggre-
gate. The cup or trophy to become the
property of the corps or battalion whose
team wins it three times in five years.
An additional badge will be given to each
competitor who makes the same score as
the winner of the first prize. Ranges,
200, 500 and 600 yards; 7 rounds at each
range; position, at 2200 yards, standing
or kneeling; at 500 yards, any, with head
to target; at 600 yards, any.
