HRI also serves the information needs of the international human rights community with an active and extensive publications program, which includes regular publications (such as HRI's quarterly *Human Rights Tribune*), human rights directories, and special or occasional publications. A key objective of HRI is to support the work of the global non-governmental community in its struggle to obtain human rights for all. To this end, HRI promotes human rights education, stimulates research, encourages the sharing of information, and builds international solidarity among those committed to the principles enshrined in the International Bill of Human Rights.
