OUTSIDE CONSULTANTS EMPLOYED BY FORMER DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRY, TRADE AND COMMERCE

Question No. 184—Mr. Blenkarn:

1. In the fiscal year (a) 1981-82 (b) 1982-83 were outside consultants employed by the then Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce and, if so (i) how many (ii) what was the total amount paid?

2. Were any consultants paid more than \$20,000 and, if so, in each case what (a) was his/her name (b) was the amount (c) services were provided?

Mr. McKinnon: Mr. Speaker, I rise on a point of order. I again ask about Question No. 368 which has been on various Order Papers for over three years. I have not yet received a reply. It is inconceivable that the Department of National Defence does not know how much it has increased its expenditures year by year over several years, as asked in the question. I would like an answer so that we can stop the misleading statements, such as the one we heard today from the Minister of National Defence about the expenditures of National Defence over the last few years.

Mr. Evans: Mr. Speaker, it seems that the Hon. Member is proceeding right here and now to say that the Minister of National Defence was misleading the House during Question Period. The Minister responded to a question, perhaps not over the entire time period the Hon. Member is concerned about, but certainly over the time period for the last five years, indicating today that the increase in spending had been 3.5 per cent. If that is not an adequate time period, we will try to get that answer for the Hon. Member. However, the Minister made that statement today. The statement has to be presumed to be correct, as the Standing Orders imply. That should satisfy to a great extent the Hon. Member's question.
