instance, the uranium mines and the Western grain handling industry.

With respect to the amendments to Part III, I would like to remind this House that these deal mostly with workers whose responsibilities are related to child care and with the problem of sexual harassment in the workplace in Canada, while the amendments to Part V are designed to promote a greater commitment on the part of workers and employers to matters of occupational safety and health.

Finally, various sections in Part V have been amended to reinforce the provisions of the Code which deal with collective bargaining. Mr. Speaker, could you tell me whether my time has expired?
