

PRAYERS.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (478), intituled: "An Act to amend the Judges Act", to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.

The said Bill was read a first time, and—

Ordered, That it be placed on the Orders of the Day for a second reading to-morrow.

The Honourable Senator Macdonald laid on the Table:—

Department of National Health and Welfare—Annual Report of the Physical Fitness Division for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1954. (English).

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Honourable Senator Kinley moved that the Bill (463), intituled: "An Act to amend the Public Service Superannuation Act", be now read a second time.

The question being put on the said motion,
It was resolved in the affirmative.

The said Bill was then read a second time, and—

Referred to the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce.
