## RUSSIAN WING IS REINFORCED

### Advance of the Germans on Piotrkow Has Been Checked.

Special Direct Copyrighted Cable to The Toronto World.

LONDON, Dec. 10.—The left wing of the Russian army in Poland has been reinforced, and the advance of the Germans on Piotrkow has been checked, says a despatch from Petrograd to a news agency here. On the 10th of the battle line before Warsaw, the Germans continue their assaults in considerable strength, but are repeatedly repulsed.

The movement of the Russian army in western Galicia continues to the south of Cracow, with a view of invading that city. The bombardment from the heights to the east and south continues.

Fourteen train loads of German prisoners passed through yesterday.
