

## STRING QUARTET MAKES IMPRESSION

## Composition of Ernst Von Dohnanyi Proves Most Alluring.

In the adagio the rich notes of the cello gave Leo Smith an opportunity to show his fully realized talent. The luscious dreamy chords of the closing passages reminded one of Mastercrafters in a soft, hazy, and beautiful mood.

The composition was very well received and much applause called the players back to be complimented on their arrangement of a Chopin study in C sharp minor, superlatively lovely, shimmering and glowing in the orchestra.

In contrast, Grainger's arrangement of the Irish reel, "Folly on the Shore," The seductive, frothy and sparkling melody was greeted with the nicest appreciation of the spirit of the folk-tune. Wolf-Ferrari's masterly work was marked by the most dramatic and characteristic movement. But the characteristic and fantastic second movement, capriccio, which yet climbed into the stratosphere, was well served to display the discriminating treatment of the players, whose response to all the music was so keen that they preserved the highest artistic level.

Mr. Welesman's playing was particularly noteworthy in the consideration of the other performers. The last concert of the season will take place on March 17, when a number of the best Belgian composers will be on the program.

If the majority of Christian people have the fruits of the Holy Spirit, they can keep their hidden, and purely many of them manifest the fruits of the Holy Spirit—anger, malice, hatred, envy, strife, bitterness, slander, etc., which the Apostle says are the works of the flesh (Ephesians 4:31; Galatians 5:19-21; John 8:7). We would not be misunderstood; we do not complain that the world is not a nice people in the eyes of the Lord. On the contrary, we compliment them on their education, their refinement, their culture, and their intelligence. We compliment them on their humanitarian sympathies, as represented in hospitals, asylums and other benevolences.

But we do not compliment them even by people not members of churches. Participation in good works is by no means the highest thing that a Christian is one who has come into a very special relationship to God. The Christian relationship exists not in
