1755. Braddock of his Arrival, to meet him at fuch Time and Place, as fhould be most convenient for both.

Mar. 18. He received a Letter by Express from General Braddock acquainting him with his Arrival; that he had Orders to have an Interview with him, and defiring him to meet him as foon as he could at Annapolis in Maryland; and in the mean time he communicated to him the Plan of the Expedition under his own immediate Command against the French Forts upon the Ohio, to be carried on with the two Britif Regiments, he had brought with him from England, and the Irregulars of Virginia and Maryland, and proposed to him for his Confideration, an Attempt to be made at the fame Time for the Reduction of the French Forts at Niagara with the two Corps of the 50th and 51ft Regiments, to be conducted under his Command.

> Mr. Shirley, at the Time of receiving this Letter, was closely engaged in making the neceffary Preparations for fitting out in due Time the two Expeditions against the French in Nova Scotia and at Crown Point (the Success of the former of which more especially depended upon the Dispatch of it) besides raising his own Regiment and the Business of his Civil Administration within his Government.
