ALLEN IN BUFFALO.

SHE FORMERLY LIVED IN TORONTO

Buffalo, May 20.—It is a strange tale
which Minerva Clarke tells of the
murder of the late Mayor of Buffalo,
John G. Beatty, which she declares fell
under the shot of a pistol held in her
hands on the night of April 23, 1894.

She declares that the admissions of
Clarence and Sadie Robinson seemed
when they were first published, she
remember the death of my father,
Alex. Clarke, and my brothers and
sisters which I knew of are alive to-day.

She tells the story of her life in Tor-
onto, making the acquaintance of
Montgomery Gibbs on King-street,
then going to Acton, Ont., to work
tailoring with Jessie Steel, a dress-
maker, of Georgetown, then to Toronto
with her mother, who resided in
Orangeville and Mrs. Allen moved with
her mother and John Clarke, her
husband followed and secured employ-
ment. She tells of a separation from
her husband, of meeting Gibbs in
Cleveland, of visiting the Pacific coast,
of returning to Toronto, of going West,
where a daughter was born, of which
Gibbs was the father, of the death by
her husband in Michigan, or her in-
effectual attempt to get Gibbs to marry
her and her determination to kill him.
Then follows her story of the murder
and of her remorse since the
conviction of Clarence Robinson and
his wife Sadie.

The story is described by the police
as a romance.

Ex-Mayor Beatty was interviewed yester-
day and said he remembered hav-
ing known her in his employ some years ago
as a young woman named Clark, whose
unaccountable actions raised the belief
that she was mentally unbalanced. She
had written several times asking Mr.
Beatty for assistance, but he had heard
nothing of her for three years.

LINGHAM'S SENTENCE.
The Belleville Man to be Released From
Prison—The Other Sentences.

London, May 20.—A despatch from Sir
Hercules Robinson, Governor of the
Cape Colony, has been received by the
Government, in which it is announced
that the Transvaal authorities have
reached a decision in the case of 20 of
the members of the Reform Union, who
were recently convicted in connection
with the conspiracy against the South
African Republic, and were sentenced
to imprisonment, fine and banishment.
A number of these prisoners will be
released immediately, and others will
be given their freedom at the expiration
of their three months, while a
portion of those still remaining in cus-
tody for a consideration of their sen-
tences after five months shall have
elapsed, and four of the condemned
men will be given the same privilege
at the end of a year from the date of
the sentences. That portion of the
judgment of the court imposing a fine
upon the convicted men will stand, but
the banishment clause will be suspended,
provided the prisoners give their
word of honor not to interfere in fu-
ture in the politics of the republic.

A Merc Master of Form.
As regards Col. Frank W. Rhodes,
Lionel Phillips, George Farrar and
John Hays members of the Reform Union,
who were condemned to death for
high treason, against the Transvaal,
Governor Robinson has decided that
they shall be commuted to 18
years' imprisonment, with a provision
that if they are not released before
their future commutation by the Execu-
tive Council of the Transvaal next
week, Gov. Robinson further states
that he learns the commutation of the
sentences of the four leaders in the
Reform movement to imprisonment for
18 years was merely a matter of form,
as it was necessary to be recipients of
Queen's Birthday honors, and that
the details upon the prisoners immedi-
ately, and that the sentences will prob-
ably not be put into effect.

The Government has received the
names of the prisoners whose sen-
tences have been commuted. The men
who are to be released at once are nine
in number. Among them are the Am-
ericans H. J. King, Capt. Mein and
Butters. Those who are to be released
after five months are four in number,
including P. R. Lingham, formerly of
Belleville, Ont. Among the 18 who
are to be released on Monday, but
are to serve five months before being
released, are the Americans V. B.
Clement and J. S. Leonard. The man
who is to be released at Cambridge
will be W. J. Jameson, brother of
Dr. Jameson. The cases of four others
have not been considered by the Execu-
tive Council, but it is expected that
petitions for a reversal of their com-
mutation of sentences.
