Free Imports for May.

Imports of free goods at the port of Toronto last month show a very large increase, as compared with the corresponding period a year ago, the free imports during May, 1897, amounting to \$351,706, while those of May, 1898, totalled \$618,912, an increase of \$267,206. Last month's imports were made up as follows: Products of the fine, \$80,083; fish, \$6; products of the forest, \$11,956; animals and their produce, \$201,885; agricultural products, \$57,560; manafactured articles, \$192,684; and miscellaneous articles, \$116,474, against \$11,196 a year ago, and wool, \$22,000, against \$13,138 last year. Other large free imports were: Horses, \$48,640; corn, \$16,054; and steels rails, \$24,258. Settlers' effects last month totalled only \$23,531, against \$34,707 during May, 1897.

Tuesday's slump in wheat by no means discounted present bearish conditions, and a further decline occurred to-day in American markets. On the Chicago board the June delivery fell 17c during the day's session, July 5½c, September 2½c and December 2½c. The day's clearances from Atlantic ports were enormous, but were regarded as simply adding to the immense quantity affont for Great Britain and Europe, which is already three times the amount on passage at the same time last year.
