Budget of Notes From Across the

Down, Owing to the Storm, and to Hand-Stocks of Grain at To-

Monday Evening, Dec. 5. Owing to the storm, wires are down all over the country, and there is, therefore, httle news to hand regarding the Chicago and other grain markets of to-thy. The deliveries of wheat and flour at the Western primary markets last week were very large—302,776 barrels flour, and 9,632,644 bushels wheat, as compared with 180,365 burrels flour and 6,469,345 bushels wheat in corresponding week of last year.

The shipments of wheat were 8,124,573 bushels, of which Duluth contributed 4,639,759 bushels.

Dec. 12, and large shipments to Burialo
will be made this week.
Bradstreet's statement of stocks of wheat held at interior elevators in the Northwest for week ending Nov. 26 showed no decrease for the week. The Chicago Daily Bulletin of Saturday says that Minneapolis reports that country deliveries in the Northwest were dropping off sharply.

The Chicago Bulletin says that some of the St. Louis flour mills have been shut down, because of their finability to use the down because of their manning to wheat from Kansas for their trade. Milwaukee millers report sales of flour to Finland and Constantinople. Continent al journals say that the Turkish Government has forbidden the import of foreign flour into Constantinople, and that the recent arrival there of some American flour hastened the decision.

European Situation.

France—The weather has been very favorable for the crops. Heavy rains have fallen, which will enable the water-power mills to run full time. Farmers have finished autumn seeding and are now threshing extensively. Offerings on interior markets have been more liberal and prices are lower. The net imports of wheat and flour for the three months ending Oct. 31 were 707,000 quarters, compared with 1,003,000 quarters in same months in 1897. Area of wheat said, to be equal to last season.

Belgium—The net imports of wheat and flour, three months, Aug. 1 to Oct. 31, 1898, were 958,000 quarters, compared with 1,030,000 quarters in the same period in 1897. The Liverpool Corn Trade News says that Germany, Belgium and Holland are proving remarkably good customers for American wheat and flour owing to the difficulty in getting supplies from Russia.

Germany—Supplies of home-grown grain are still very small, and the demand has been mainly furnished by American wheat. Generally satisfactory reports are being received concerning the autumn seedings, Hungary has been the best buyer of Roumanian wheat.

Russia—Odessa advises that stocks of wheat are beginning to accumulate, and that they are likely to increase further, unless biyers advance their bids. Rye is arriving in driblets, and would make it appear that the crop was a failure, although the official returns show the contrary. The quantity of wheat in chief Russian ports on Nov. 13 was 14,056,000 bushels, compared with 12,560,000 bushels on same date in 1897. The Corn Trade News says: Russia seems disposed to spread her deliveries over a larger period than usual, and, with larger receipts at her ports, it is not likely that in these days of powerful "ice-breakers," any marked cessation of supplies from there will be seen. The News gives the following estimates of the crops of 1898, by the Ministry of Agriculture: Rye C05,848,000 bushels; oats, 591,224,000; barley, 310,330,000. This compares with final estimate for 1897 as follows: Rye, 608,

4. The railroads have all the freight they can carry; and, as evidence that their earnings are not on a starwing scale, they have given out orders within the last few days for 500,000 tons of steel rails, valued at \$9,000,000.
5. The peace negotiations have concluded with our acquisition of the Philippine and Solu Islands, and with every prospect that the treaty will be ratified by the Senate.


