OTTAWA, Aug. 18.—The completion of the Walker, the Bankers' matches and the McDonald "Brier" match at two ranges with the Gibson revolver and extra series competitions, made up the program of the third day of the P. D. Bankers' matches, which have so far been held in beautiful weather and without any accident to mar the pleasure of the meet.

FINANCIAL CONDITION OF NEW ZEALAND IS PRONOUNCED EXCELLENT

London, Aug. 19.—Canadian associates Press—New Zealand advises show that the Dominion is comfortable financially. The revenue from last year exceeded the expenditure, which will be the case this year. The government purchased 210,000 acres of land for the settlement of discharged soldiers at a cost of \$2,350,000. New Zealand's total war expenditure to March was \$77,000,000, and \$3,500,000 more has yet to be expended. Nearly \$24,000,000 was raised in the Dominion. A compulsory levy is foreseen for further necessary borrowing.

ALL CANDIDATES MAY SPEAK AT COLUMBUS FAIR ON AUGUST 31

Columbus, Ohio, Aug. 19.—Three presidential candidates, all Ohioans, may speak from the same platform at the Ohio State Fair here August 31. Plans of the management are carried out. Watkins, prohibition party candidate asking that he also deliver an address.
