BAR SILVER MAKES

NEW YORK, Dec. 10 .- Bar silver coninued to decline on the local market oday, selling at 59% c an ounce, a new ow record, after London reported a break to 38%d, a new minimum quotation at that centre. The decline extended to Mexican dollars, which sold

tended to Mexican dollars, which sold here at 45%c.
London, which controls the silver market, attributes the steady shrinkage of prices to the lack of demand from China, which for years has been the largest consumer of the white metal.

Many silver mines in Canada and the United States and Mexico, especially those producing law-grade ore, have suspended production during the last month or two because the fall in the price of the metal has rendered operations unprofitable.

Social Workers Also Decide to Appoint

The Social Service Council, the Neighorhood Workers and others interested in helping needy families during the winter have established a "Confidenwinter have established a "Confidential Exchange," from which warm clothing and other necessities will be distributed to needy ones.

The exchange has been established with the idea of preventing overlapping and seeing that every family is cared for. All help which will be rendered through the various organizations will pass through the exchange. That this is the best way possible to look after deserving families was the conclusion arrived at by a representative meeting of social workers Thursday.

It was also decided to form a committee to scatter good cheer to the poor during the Christmas season. The members of this committee have not yet been appointed.

LATTER DAY SAINTS WIN APPEAL AGAINST

Decision of Chief Justice Falconbridge Reversed-Plaintiff Given Costs.

Following an appeal instituted by the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints against Bishop R. C. Latter Day Saints against Bisnop R. C. Evans of Toronto, formerly of this city, in the appellate division at Osgoode Hall, the decision of this court reverses that of Chief Justice Falconbridge, and sustains the appeal. The case is a long-drawn-out tangle, and was first brought to public notice when the Peorganized Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints, of which there is a congregation in this city, entered suit against Bishop R. C. Evans, formerly in charge of the lecal church, for an accounting of Sunday school religio, church buuilding sermon, theatre and Women's Auxiliary funds, the defendant having severed his connection with the church.

The case came up for hearing before Chief Justice Falconbridge and on January 14 last, his decision dismissed the action. An appea was immediately entered by the Latter Day Saints and was heard in the appellate division, composed of Justices Masten, Ferguson, Mulock and Sutherland at Osgoode Hall, Toronto. On November 18 last this division allowed the appeal on the Women's Auxiliary and other funds, excepting those of theatre and sermon, on condition that one person entersuit for an accounting of funds on behalf of the organizations involved. The plaintiffs were allowed the cost, thus reversing the decision of Chief Justice Falconbridge.
