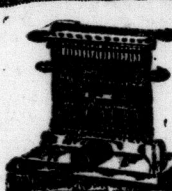

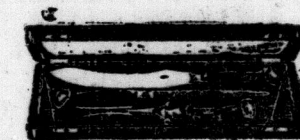

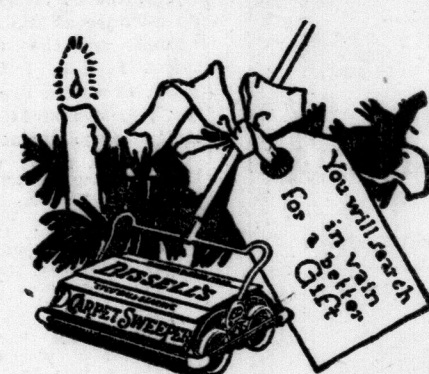

BAR SILVER MAKES NEW LOW RECORD

Continues To Decline, Selling
At 59 1-4 Cents An
Ounce.

NEW YORK, Dec. 10.—Bar silver continued to decline on the local market today, selling at 59 1/4 an ounce, a new low record, after London reported a break to 38 1/2, a new minimum quotation at that centre. The decline extended to Mexican dollars, which sold here at 45 1/2.

London, which controls the silver market, attributes the steady shrinkage of prices to the lack of demand from China, which for years has been the largest consumer of the white metal. Many silver mines in Canada and the United States and Mexico, especially those producing low-grade ore, have suspended production during the last month or two because the fall in the price of the metal has rendered operations unprofitable.

CONFIDENTIAL EXCHANGE TO DISTRIBUTE AID TO NEEDY FAMILIES IN CITY

Social Workers Also Decide to Appoint a "Good Cheer" Committee.

The Social Service Council, the Neighborhood Workers and others interested in helping needy families during the winter have established a "Confidential Exchange," from which warm clothing and other necessities will be distributed to needy ones.

The exchange has been established with the idea of preventing overlapping and seeing that every family is cared for. All help which will be rendered through the various organizations will pass through the exchange. That this is the best way possible to look after deserving families was the conclusion arrived at by a representative meeting of social workers Thursday.

LATTER DAY SAINTS WIN APPEAL AGAINST BISHOP R. C. EVANS

Decision of Chief Justice Falconbridge Reversed—Plaintiff Given Costs.

Following an appeal instituted by the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints against Bishop R. C. Evans of Toronto, formerly of this city, in the appellate division at Osgoode Hall, the decision of this court reversing that of Chief Justice Falconbridge, and sustains the appeal. The case is a long-drawn-out tangle, and was first brought to public notice when the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints, of which there is a congregation in this city, entered suit against Bishop R. C. Evans, formerly in charge of the local church, for an accounting of Sunday school, religious, church building, sermon, theatre and Women's Auxiliary funds, the defendant having severed his connection with the church.

The case came up for hearing before Chief Justice Falconbridge and on January 14 last, his decision dismissed the action. An appeal was immediately entered by the Latter Day Saints and was heard in the appellate division, composed of Justices Mastron, Ferguson, Mulock and Sutherland at Osgoode Hall, Toronto. On November 18 last this division allowed the appeal on the ground that one person enter suit for an accounting of funds on behalf of the organizations involved. The plaintiffs were allowed the cost, thus reversing the decision of Chief Justice Falconbridge.

On Wednesday last, W. R. Smyth, K.C., for the defendant, moved at Osgoode Hall to vary the minutes of the judgment of November 18, and the motion was refused. Costs in the case, amounting to about \$1,625, were awarded to the plaintiffs. In addition, according to information given out by the Church of the Latter Day Saints, Bishop Evans must pay \$3,000 to the Women's Auxiliary of the church in the accounting of funds, and although the first decision of the courts dismissed their action, local members of the Latter Day Saints claim a victory over Bishop Evans in the upholding of their appeal and judgments for costs handed

TORONTO HOCKEY CLUB'S APPLICATION DISMISSED

Toronto, Dec. 10.—Justice Latchford has dismissed the application by the Toronto Hockey Club which sought to set aside the order of Justice Middleton on November 20, appointing C. E. Robin, receiver of the Arena Gardens, Limited.

Justice Latchford said that if the Toronto Hockey Club holds a valid contract for the use of the arena during the approaching season it will no doubt submit as against the receiver just as it would if the receiver had not been appointed.

C. N. R. EMPLOYEES ASK ARBITRATION ON HANNA'S ORDER

Toronto, Dec. 10.—It was definitely announced this afternoon that the negotiations between the Canadian National Railway's employees and the management regarding President Hanna's order regarding politics, had failed, and that the committee last night sent an application to Ottawa for a board of arbitration on the same, under the industrial disputes act.

WILL DRAW UP SCHEDULE. Pittsburg, Pa., Dec. 10.—Officials of the United States Amateur Hockey League will meet here next Sunday to act upon the application of the Pittsburgh Hockey Club for admission into the organization. A schedule for the year's competition will be drawn up and announced by the National League.

DISCUSSED BOYS' WORK.—A discussion on Anglican Boys' Work in the city was held by the Anglican Clerical Association Friday in Cronyn Hall. Bishop David Williams also gave an account of the Lambeth conference. The association decided to call a meeting on Monday next for the purpose of dealing further with Boys' Work. Rev. Dean L. N. Tucker presided.

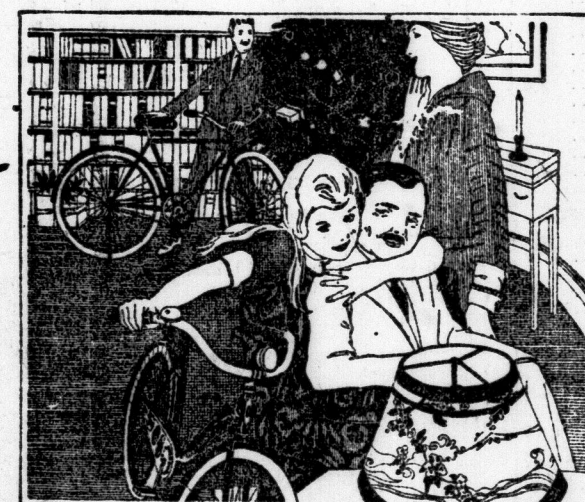
