LAWSON IN QUOD AGAIN FOR THEFT FROM SON

Mayor Stewart Will Have Legal Representation at Osgoode Hall To-Morrow

HAMILTON, Aug. 4.—(Special)—Wm. Lawson, the deputy returning officer who got into trouble over the ballots at the last provincial election, was arrested again today on the charge of stealing a small sum of money from his son.

When the application of H. C. Beckett and the Ontario attorney general to sign the power by-law comes up at Osgoode Hall Thursday the case will be on hand and will be represented by a competent lawyer.

EARTHQUAKE IN ALGERIA. Severe Shock, But No Fatalities Are Reported.

CONSTANTINE, Algeria, Aug. 4.—A violent earthquake was reported here at 20 minutes past 2 this morning. It lasted ten seconds and did great damage. No people were killed here, but it is reported that a number of lives were lost in the nearby towns.

Continued From Page 1. post, they are laid aside by the teller. Once a week, the state banks ship these bills to Washington to be exchanged for fresh bills. They must, however, get the same terms from the department, be sorted according to denomination.

The national banks, having a closer connection with the national government, thru the deposits of United States funds which they hold, make these shipments about twice a week.

There is no profit for us in sending these bills to Washington. I only make for us, and the only satisfaction we get is getting dirty bills out of circulation.

There has been a very perceptible falling off in the quantity of American silver in circulation here, and as it was usually 50 per cent. defaced or "plugged," its disappearance has been welcomed.

The smaller denominations are particularly noticeable for the disappearance of dirty condition owing to the large fishing and mill operations in this vicinity. The change of currency should be made more frequent.

There is no doubt a considerable amount of defaced silver and copper here, which is thought will work out of the main channel. The biggest percentage is American coin, both silver and copper.

The Canadian coin on the whole is well preserved, particularly quarters and dimes. The same cannot be said of the small change.

There is a noticeable improvement in the bank note circulation. The local banks are calling in old notes and mutilating every note of their own particular denomination, which is not clean and passable.
