Convocation Hall at the University of Toronto was crowded last night by a large and representative audience who gathered to hear an address by Sir Wilfrid Laurier upon the Famous Murder Trial in Toronto 100 Years Ago.

The lecture was given under the auspices of the Newman Club, organized by the Rev. J. J. O'Rourke, Catholic undergraduate of the university.

Mr. Justice Latchford presided, and among other prominent people present were the Hon. J. S. Macdonald, Archbishop McNeil, Principal Falconer and N. W. Rowell.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier on rising was greeted with loud and prolonged applause, and he thanked the audience for the honor of his presence.
