

JUDGMENT APPEALED BY THE HOME BANK

Favors C. H. Caham, Sr., in Suit for Large Sum—May Go to Privy Council.

Montreal, Feb. 11.—In the superior court this afternoon Justice McLennan rendered judgment, ordering the Home Bank to pay the sum of \$205,500.27 to the Corporation Securities Limited.

Young Caham drew up cheques on the Home Bank to his own personal and private account. The cheques were countersigned by B. Bowler, secretary-manager of the corporation, who also disappeared.

The Corporation Securities pleaded that the authority of C. H. Caham, jun., was limited, that his title was defective and that he did not act in the usual course of business.

The bank stated to The Toronto World that night that the judgment has already been appealed by the bank.
