## BYE-LAWS.

Passed at the Ninth Annual Meeting of the Society, in harlottetown, December 28th, 1852, and since amended.

1st. His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor for the time eing, if a member of the United Church of England and reland, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of his Society, as now incorporated by Act of Colonial Parament, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel and for promoting Christian Knowledge.

2d. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the society; and his approval shall be necessary for the confirmation, revocation and alteration of any of the Bye-Laws, and for asking any addition to them.

3d. All members of the Church are invited to unite with is Society as Subscribers. Any sum, however small, paid in tvance, shall qualify a person to be a member for a year; and in Pounds at one payment, shall entitle one to be a member or life.

4th. The Annual General Meeting of the Society shall take lace in Charlottetown, on the 4th Wednesday in January, then a Report of the proceedings of the past year, and the reasurer's Account shall be presented, and all Officers chosen Special General Meeting may be called at any time, when he President,—or in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents,—or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable.

5th. The Committee Meetings shall be held on the 3d Tuesay and 4th Wednesday in January, and on the 3d Tuesdays in pril, July and October,,—seven members to constitute a Quom; and Special Meetings on such other days as the President, one of the Vice Presidents, and five members of the
