young people of the Congregation, will avail themselves of the excellent

instruction thus placed within their reach.

The operations of the Ladies' Aid Society have been conducted with their accustomed energy, and substantial aid has been given to the city charities, and to many poor and needy ones who have been so fortunate as to receive their care.

The District Visitors have afforded much assistance to the Pastor in his work, and merit the thanks of the Session for their continued

The Session record with much satisfaction a considerable increase in the number of those contributing to the schemes of the Church, and a consequent increase in the amount contributed. This liberality has enabled the Session without drawing as largely on the balance in hand as they did last year, to allocate a slightly increased amount to the schemes of the Church.
