OCTOBER .- Farmers who have ample barn room, with their grain safe from rats, and who are not compelled to hurry it early to market, will do best to leave their thrashing till winter. A small machine, driven by a two-horse, endless chain power, will enable them to go through the work at that time with little help from attendance. The straw will be fresh, and therefore preferred by animals. It should be well stacked and protected from the weather, and it will then very materially aid in wintering the stock. You may place the straw where it will be accessible at all times and thus save good hay.
