

RADIO CANNOT DIVULGUE NEWS

Chester S. Lord Tells Need of Editors—Country Requires Good Ones Now as Never Before, Because of the Great Problems of the Present.

New York, Jan. 26.—The radio will not supplant the newspaper as a distributor of news, said Chester S. Lord, editor, author and chancellor of the University of the State of New York in answer to a question at the close of his address last evening at the Central Branch of the Brooklyn Y. M. C. A. Henson Place, on Journalism as a profession.

There are between 7,000 and 7,500 newspaper men now actively engaged in the work in New York City, Mr. Lord said. "Unfortunately, not all of these 7,000 can be editor-in-chief, and they must be a large extent writer under direction. But in a village the conditions are reversed. The editor generally owns the sheet, and may write as he pleases. The editor in the village is one of the most influential citizens."

She packed all her furniture and belongings in July, 1921, and sailed for England, in sorrow, to spend the rest of her life in her childhood home at Lincoln, near London.
