The election in Saskatchewan yesterday resulted as follows: F. B. Doncaster, mayor; Arthur B. Tower, Edgar Ayer, George F. Estabrook, Stewart Babcock, Clyde G. Steadman, as aldermen.

Hope for a further gratuity to veterans during the coming session of the federal parliament is discouraged by C. Grant MacNeill, Dominion secretary of the G. W. V. A., who says that attempts to dictate to the government are merely "baying at the moon."

A message of Canada's friendship for the United States, a presentation of the Dominion's problems, and an exposition of her progress, were the subjects dealt with by E. M. Macdonald, of Pictou, N. S., former M. P., in an address to the Canadian Club of Boston last evening.

"No bill," was the verdict of the grand jury last evening in Frederick in the case of the King vs. Herbert L. Stephenson, charged with wounding Arthur L. Noble with intent to kill. The jury was out two and a half hours.

William H. Myrton was burned to death when his home in Boston was damaged by fire yesterday. The fire is thought to have been started from a pipe which the father had been smoking.
