Major R. W. Leonard has been retired from his position as head of the National Transcontinental Commission and the duties of the commission have been transferred to the minister of railways. Major Leonard will now look after his numerous private interests.

R. M. Raymond of New York, a graduate of U. N. B., in 1875, has donated \$2,000 towards the fund for a new laboratory building for the university.

Burglars entered the Salisbury post office on Wednesday night and rifled the cash box and tore open many letters. As far as is known their loot was confined to a calabash pipe and fifty cents in change.

Divers have recovered the bodies of two more men and two women from the wrecked Empress of Ireland.

TALK OF CONFEDERATION (Halifax Chronicle)

Two members of the Newfoundland Government, who were in Halifax yesterday stated that the question of confederation had recently attained considerable prominence in the Ancient Colony, but neither apparently considered there was any possibility of any immediate movement for alliance with Canada.

Hon. J. B. Bennett, colonial secretary, who was returning after a trip to New York, stated that recent discussion of the question had arisen apparently spontaneously, but he did not think there was anything particularly vital behind it now.
