**Was 108 Years Old**  
On March 22 Mrs. Ellen Moore breathed her last at the residence of her son-in-law near the town of Monaghan, Ireland, at the advanced age of 108 years. Her nephew, a newspaper man, aged over 75, said of her in his paper, "The Monaghan Standard," that she was a good specimen of a genuine Irishwoman, who loved her country and wished it well. She had a wonderfully retentive memory to the last, and nothing pleased her better than to recount incidents which she had witnessed in her early days. Up to within a week before her death she had full enjoyment of all her faculties and could read and enjoy her Bible to the last.

**Was Huge Meteorite**  
Rome, April 17—What was believed to be an earthquake shock last week has been explained by the discovery, near Cantana, of a huge meteorite imbedded in the hillside in a pit of its own making that was nearly thirty feet deep. Several other fragments of the meteorite were found in the neighborhood.

## MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

An inquest into the death of Newell Paul, an Indian, whose body was found lying beside the railway at Watt Junction a few days ago, was held by Coroner J. D. Lawson, of St. Stephen. A verdict of accidental death was returned. There had been drinking.

F. L. Peters, D. L. S. C. E., son of Colonel J. Peters, of Victoria, B. C., has been appointed to the staff of the irrigation and hydraulic government survey office at Calgary, a division of the forestry branch of the department of the interior. He is but a young man, having lately graduated from the R. M. C.

Three stores and the post office at Chocolate Cove, N. B., were broken into Friday night and about \$20 in cash was secured by the robbers, besides a quantity of candy and beer.

The Salisbury & Harvey Railway will not run their trains below Hillsboro after May 1. This will leave Albert, which has been the terminus of the road, some twenty miles from railway communication.

Robert Degraze, of Carleton Place, Des Cheneaux, aged 23, was drowned in Louis Basin, Quebec, on Saturday. He was employed on the government steamer Princess, and was going on board the steamer Canada to visit a friend when he fell overboard.
