HOPPE FINDS THE JAP EASY

New York, Oct. 21.—Willie Hoppe, national billiard champion, defeated Kokie Yamada, Japanese expert, in tonight's game on national championship tournament, 400 to 120. Yamada did not play with his usual dexterity, while Hoppe gave a brilliant exhibition of cue work and ran out his quota of 400 in the eighth inning with an average of 80. His three highest runs were 138; 115; 72. This is the best average made so far in the tournament. Yamada's average was 16 1-2, and his best runs were 49; 26; 21.

Dr. Hastings, M.H.O., has issued a warning against the danger of the "so-called common cold." Under the heading of "Some Important Don'ts" he says:

- Don't sit or work in an over-heated room.
- Don't use sprays or douches for your nose unless under the doctor's order and instructions.
- Don't sneeze or cough except into a handkerchief or a piece of cheesecloth.
- Don't allow anyone else to sneeze or cough towards you.
- Don't allow any member of the family who has an acute cold to come in close contact with other members of the household, or to use the same eating and drinking utensils, towels, etc.
- Don't go to any public meeting if you have a cold.
- Don't talk into anyone's face if you have a cold, and don't, under any circumstances, shake hands with anyone while you have an acute cold.
- Don't neglect or treat lightly a cold. It may be the beginning of influenza, pneumonia, measles, tuberculosis, whooping cough.

provinces toured in the United States, Australia and South Africa. Like his father, Irving was extremely versatile, his talents being adapted both to comedy and tragedy.

The wife of Sir Henry Irving, and mother of Henry B., was Miss O'Callaghan, and an earnest dissenter in religion, violently opposed to the stage as a profession. She was married when her famous husband was a bank clerk, but when he took to the stage they separated, though remaining on friendly terms, she taking the two boys, H. B. and Lawrence to live with her, all being well provided for by Sir Henry.

Lady Irving devoted her life to engendering a distaste for the stage in her sons, Sir Henry abetting her. H. B., being trained in the law and becoming a barrister. Lawrence was destined for a diplomatic career, but both sons took to the stage, in spite of parental objections, and both did very well, though Lawrence took more to playwriting.

H. B. Irving made a distinct success as an actor and was held to be a worthy successor to his famous father. He married Dorothea Baird, who was a striking success on the stage as the original Trilby. She has since her marriage been active in alleviating the condition of the poor in London, in work identified with the Duchess of Marlborough. She was

one of the few women put by King George on the "Honor List" for active war work. The H. B. Irvings have a son and a daughter, the former in the Royal Flying Corps.

GIANTIC DRIBBLES

Ships Being Built Five Times Larger Than R-34

Minneapolis, Minn., Oct. 22.—That dirigibles capable of carrying one thousand barrels of flour from Minneapolis to New York are under construction in England and Italy, was announced here by Major Charles J. Glidden, who arrived here with Commodore Beaumont, who is president of a special committee to organize the first aerial derby around the world.

These dirigibles, Major Glidden states will contain from five to ten million cubic feet of hydrogen, which lifts seventy pounds per thousand feet, making the total lifting capacity of the dirigible seven hundred thousand pounds of which fifty per cent is useful load. The new dirigible will be from three to five times larger than the R-34.
