BOY, MISTAKEN FOR A MOOSE, IS SHOT DEAD

With the big game season only two days old, Halliburton Brown, aged twenty, son of Wilfred Brown, of St. Martins, was shot in mistake for a moose early Friday night and died two hours afterwards. John Holland and Graydon Gilchrist, both of St. Martins, the latter a brother-in-law of the dead young man, both fired in the direction of Brown, but which of the two bullets struck him, causing his death, has not yet been ascertained. An inquest was begun Saturday by Dr. A. G. Gilmour, coroner, St. Martins, and after hearing the evidence of the dead boy's father, two companions, who were with him at the time, and the two men, the inquiry was adjourned until this evening. The funeral was held on Sunday and was one of the largest witnessed in St. Martins.

Halliburton Brown, the dead young man, was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Wilford Brown, of Bay View, St. Martins. He was engaged helping his father in farming and lumbering. He is survived by his parents, two sisters and three brothers.

JANNEY BREAKS HUNGER STRIKE

Lethbridge, Alta., Sept. 18—Capt. E. L. Janney has broken his hunger strike. Saturday morning he ate some dry toast and drank some postum served him at Galt Hospital, thus breaking his forty-second day fast. He was prevailed upon to do this by officers of the local branch of the army and navy veterans, of which organization he is a member, and the investigation of his charges against the officials of the Lethbridge jail for improper treatment while there awaiting trial now will be proceeded with. The investigation will likely start Monday.

ORPHANAGE FAIR DAILY NEWSLETTER

To the Protestants of N. B., Greetings:
Our letter of Saturday closed with the statement that we needed your co-operation. In today's paper we purpose following that up with a few suggestions as to how this may best be done. We have no desire whatever to restrict or hold you down to accepting any of our suggestions. A ready mind needs little tutoring, many will no doubt be able to think out plans far better suited to their own individual cases than any ideas which we might suggest.

First of all, let it be clearly understood that cash contributions from those who can afford it are the first consideration. There is a saying, "It takes money to make money." This is true even in running a fair in aid of the orphans. While we hope to solicit most of the goods required, there is always considerable expense incurred in making preliminary arrangements, etc. Then, again, every dollar in cash means one hundred cents added to the surplus of the close, while goods are often disposed of at a sacrifice. Cash or contributions of any kind may be forwarded, as soon as convenient, to the secretary, secretary orphans fair committee, P. O. Box 12, St. John, N. B. Fraternal societies, churches and other bodies should unite and organize this work in all parts of the province. DEADLOCK IN IRISH MATTERS

In a message from Premier Lloyd George to Eamonn DeValera, the British premier maintained his former stand in refusing to meet the Irish delegates as representing an independent and sovereign state. Unless the Irish delegates adopt some other designation he intimates that he will continue to refuse to deal with them.

The text of the prime minister's message follows:
"I have received your telegram of last night and observe it does not modify the claim that your delegates should meet us as representatives of sovereign and independent state."

"You made no such condition when you came to see me in July. I invited

you then to meet me, in the words of my letter, as the chosen leader of the great majority in southern Ireland, and you accepted that invitation.

"From the very outset of our conversation I told you that we looked to Ireland to own allegiance to the throne, and to make her future as a member of the British Commonwealth. That was the basis of our proposals and we cannot alter it."

"The status you now claim in advance for your delegates is in effect a repudiation of that basis. I am prepared to meet your delegates, as I met you in July, in the capacity of the chosen spokesmen for your people to discuss the association of Ireland with the British Commonwealth."

"My colleagues and I cannot meet them as representatives of a sovereign and independent state without disloyalty on our part to the throne and the empire. I must therefore repeat that until the second paragraph of your letter of the 12th is withdrawn a conference between us is impossible."

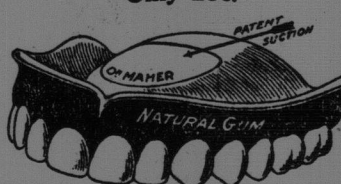

replying yesterday to Mr. Lloyd George, declared the Sinn Fein had already accepted the prime minister's invitation in its own exact terms. They had not asked the prime minister to abandon any principle, and had only one object in seeking a conference on the basis of truth, he declared.

Mr. De Valera's reply to the prime minister's telegram was given out by the Sinn Fein publicity department. It was drafted by him at Black Rock and brought to the Mansion House, where it was made public by Arthur Griffith and Eamonn J. Duggan, and was distributed to the press by Desmond Fitzgerald, propaganda minister.

The text of Mr. De Valera's reply follows:
"In reply to your last telegram just received, I have only to say that we have already accepted your invitation in the exact words which you require from your letter of the seventh instant. We have not asked you to abandon any principle, even informally, but surely you can understand that we can only recognize ourselves for what we are."

"If this self-recognition be made a reason for consideration of the conference we regret it, but it seems inconsistent. Issue of Recognition."

"I have already had conferences with you and in these conferences and in my written communications I have never ceased to recognize myself for what I was and am. If this involves recognition on your part then you have already recognized us."

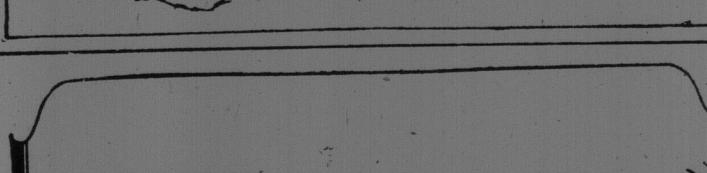
